Dear Acting Commissioner Dudek:

We write to express our grave concerns about recent reports that the Social Security Administration (SSA) was considering eliminating telephone services. Millions of Americans, especially older adults and individuals with disabilities, rely on this essential service to manage their benefits and navigate the complexities of the Social Security system. We commend your decision to cancel this proposal, and urge you to protect this critical service in the future.

The SSA processes millions of phone calls every year. In fiscal year 2024 alone, the agency received nearly 80 million calls to its 1-800 number¹, with phone-based claims accounting for about 40% of all claims processed². For many beneficiaries, online services are simply not an option due to technological limitations, lack of internet access, or physical and cognitive impairments. Eliminating or reducing phone services would leave these individuals without the support they rely on to manage their benefits.

Over 7 million seniors receive at least 90% of their income from Social Security³, and delays in receiving their benefits could leave them unable to afford basic necessities like food and housing. Any interruption in payments would be disastrous for millions of Americans who rely on these benefits to cover everyday living expenses.

Requiring beneficiaries to seek assistance exclusively online, through artificial intelligence, or in person at SSA field offices would create additional barriers, particularly for those who live far from an office. This change would disrupt services for 73 million Americans³—especially seniors and people with disabilities who depend on the toll-free number for help with claims processing, direct-deposit transactions, updating personal information, or simply getting answers to questions⁴.

The SSA is facing significant backlogs and increased wait times due to ongoing staffing shortages. Further cuts, including plans to close in-person field offices, would only exacerbate these challenges, making phone services even more crucial.

We strongly urge you to consider the individuals who may be harmed, as eliminating or reducing phone services would create unnecessary barriers for the most vulnerable populations, at a time ¹when they already face so many challenges. Social Security benefits are earned entitlements that individuals contribute to throughout their entire working lives, and every American deserves the opportunity to access those benefits in a way that is accessible and equitable.

Thank you for your attention to this critical issue. We trust that you will take these concerns seriously and work to preserve essential services that allow Social Security beneficiaries to access the benefits they have earned and rely on.


